In 1884 Bolton opened its first museum. The collections grew, thanks to the enthusiasm of a local mill owner's daughter, Annie Barlow, who worked with the EES to bring Egypt to Bolton. From mummies to jewellery, and statues to temple columns, the collections span several thousand years of history. Over 130 years later, Bolton's new Egyptian display is one of the UK's largest and best ancient Egyptian collections.
